Overview

Student knowledge exchange is a rapidly evolving area of interest and opportunity within the Higher Education sector. Call for Speakers

The roundtable discussions will build on the work/initiative/project (etc.) introduced at the beginning of the session, providing an opportunity for dialogue and learning between attendees. We are interested in submissions that explore: co-production, inclusion and accessibility, place-based approaches, capturing impact, policy and practice, and innovative and entrepreneurial approaches within student KE. However, we also encourage submissions that fall outside of these outlined categories. Please indicate in your submission what themes or topics you would be interested in exploring further within your round-table discussion.
